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Nearly 70 Indiana Schools to Receive 2017–2018 RAMP School Honor

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ALEXANDRIA, VA. – The American School Counselor Association (ASCA) recently announced that 69 Indiana schools will become Recognized ASCA Model Programs (RAMP). Indiana surpassed the record number of RAMP-designations for one state in a given year, with 69 schools receiving the honor.

The RAMP designation, awarded for aligning with the criteria in the ASCA National Model, recognizes schools committed to delivering an exemplary comprehensive, data-driven school counseling program. Since the program’s inception, more than 800 schools have been designated as RAMP recipients. This year, 140 schools nationwide will receive the RAMP designation.

The schools will be honored at a recognition ceremony at ASCA’s Annual Conference in Los Angeles, Calif., on Monday, July 16, 2018, for making an outstanding commitment to comprehensive school counseling programs.
